Choose from Eguchiya—steeped in history—or Suigoen, where the scenery of Lake Kasumigaura soothes the soul. Both offer warm hospitality and the chance to savor the flavors of the season.

Eguchiya



A lakeside *kominka* that captures the charm of old Japan



Eguchiya is a 120-year-old former sake brewery converted into a traditional *kominka* guesthouse, now with a craft beer brewery on the grounds offering distinctive brews. Rooms feature tatami and wood floors, with amenities such as an *irori* sunken hearth for an authentic cultural experience—perfect for a relaxed stay with family and friends.

Breakfast includes locally grown Koshihikari rice cooked in a traditional iron pot, miso soup with freshly picked vegetables, Mito natto, and simmered smelt from Lake Kasumigaura. It's also popular as a place to start your day in the best possible way.

Suigoen



An exclusive resort wrapped in the gentleness of nature



A rental property set on a hill within the Class II Special Protection Zone of Suigo-Tsukuba Quasi-National Park, Suigoen overlooks Lake Kasumigaura, Japan's second-largest lake. You can watch the sun rise over the lake from your balcony and even the bedrooms.

Built during the Showa Era (1926-89), the original house was renovated into an inn radiating the warmth of locally sourced timber. The refrigerator is stocked with local Ibaraki sake, wine and craft beer, and dinner plans featuring local ingredients are available, offering a luxurious interval that satisfies both body and soul.
